




### **Vote Solar Poll Results**

#### **Overview**

- Survey conducted January 25 to February 2, 2022.
- 1360 surveys completed by adults living in Pennsylvania, including an oversample of residents living in the southwest region of the state.
- Modeled margin of error: +/- 2.4%.
- Survey fielded online using Change Research/Embold's proprietary Dynamic Online Sampling Engine.
- Data weighted to accurately depict the state's gender, age, education, 2020 vote, and regional distribution.


## **Benchmark Favorability: Politicians**

How favorable are your feelings about each of the following public figures and groups?





How favorable are your feelings about each of the following public figures and groups?






How concerned are you personally about climate change?




### Support for Electricity Generation

Do you support or oppose the following types of electricity generation in Pennsylvania?




# **Increasing Solar Production**




# **Changing Opinion of Solar**

Do the following statements make you more or less supportive of solar electricity? [Much more supportive]




